The Advisory Commission and the GGNRA are ignoring provisions in the United States Code which would allow off-leash recreation. Specifically, the US Code states that each park's enabling statute and accompanying legislative history are to be the <u>guiding principles</u> for each specific park unit and these cannot be overridden by the requirement to govern each park unit uniformly.

The enabling statute for the GGNRA has four distinguishing provisions related to recreational use. In the legislative history, off-leash recreation is identified as an example of a valid recreational use.

The solution is NOT to ban the 1979 Pet Policy, but to incorporate it into the regulations as a special rule for the GGNRA – just as hang gliding and off-trail bicycle riding are permitted by special rules.
